What Is Affiliate Marketing?

Affiliate marketing is when you promote someone else's product or service and earn a commission every time someone buys it through your link. You don't handle customer service. You don't ship products. You just tell people:

"Yo, click this link. It's fire." And if they do? You get paid.

From Amazon to supplements to software — there are affiliate programs for everything.

How to Be Successful at Affiliate Marketing

Affiliate marketing is simple... but not easy.

The jabronis who fail do one of the following:

- Promote trash products they don't understand
- Spam links with no strategy
- Give up after 3 posts and 0 clicks

The successful ones:

Pick a niche they know

- Build trust with content
- Use good products they would actually use
- Stay consistent long enough to gain traction

So let's get you in the game — jabroni-free.

Affiliate Marketing Step-by-Step Checklist (Beginner Edition)

1. Pick a Niche That Doesn't Suck

You're not selling everything to everyone. Pick a lane.

Checklist:

- Choose something you're into (fitness, tech, finance, parenting, gaming, dating)
- Make sure it has products people already buy online
- Check if there are affiliate programs in that space
- Avoid super tiny niches unless you're ready to go ultra specific

2. 🧠 Find Products and Sign Up for Affiliate Programs

Checklist:

- Join beginner-friendly affiliate networks:
 - Amazon Associates
 - o ShareASale
 - Impact

- ClickBank (for digital products)
- o Digistore24
- CJ Affiliate
- Or go direct to brand websites → scroll to bottom → look for "Affiliate"
- Get your unique tracking links after you're approved
- Keep a spreadsheet of your affiliate programs, logins, and payouts

3. X Create a Content Platform (Pick 1 to Start)

Checklist:

- YouTube (faceless channels work see our last checklist)
- TikTok or Instagram Reels (quick videos, low effort)
- Blog or email list (for SEO nerds and long-game legends)
- Twitter/X (great for finance, side hustle, tech)
- Use Linktree, Stan.Store, or your own site to house your links

4. 🔬 Make Content That Doesn't Suck (And Still Sells)

Stop being a billboard. Be helpful. Be funny. Be you.

Checklist:

- Use your affiliate product in a real or funny way
- Create tutorials, reviews, "top 5," "what I use," or reaction videos
- Add your affiliate link in the caption or bio

- Say "link in bio" or "check the comments" instead of dropping spammy links
- Don't just post once aim for 3–5 pieces per week minimum

5. Track Clicks & Test What Works

Checklist:

- Use free link trackers (Bitly, Stan.Store, or your affiliate dashboard)
- Track:
 - Clicks
 - Conversions
 - Which platforms are performing
- Double down on what works
- Kill off what doesn't

6. E Build an Email List (Optional but OP)

Checklist:

- Offer a freebie (e.g., "Top 10 Gear Under \$50")
- Use platforms like ConvertKit, Beehiiv, or MailerLite
- Collect emails through your content or site
- Promote affiliate links in newsletters with tips and reviews
- Always provide value before pitching anything

7. Scale the Biz

Checklist:

- Recycle top content into new formats (TikToks → YouTube Shorts → blog)
- Outsource editing/writing once you're making \$\$
- Apply for higher-ticket affiliate programs (software, coaching, premium products)
- Build a niche brand (e.g., Failurenaire Gear Guide, Jabroni Picks of the Month)
- Consider your own product later (course, merch, ebook)

Bonus Tips from the Failurenaire

- **Don't force it.** If you wouldn't use the product, don't promote it.
- Don't wait to "feel ready." You'll learn faster by doing.
- Don't stop after 2 weeks. Most affiliate legends were posting in the dark for months before the money came.
- And NEVER tell people "this isn't financial advice." That's a jabroni move.
